The Chumash: The Stone Edition, edited by Rabbi Nosson Scherman and Rabbi Meir Zlotowitz (New York: Artscroll Series/Mesorah Publications, 1993ff)

Reform:

The Torah: A Modern Commentary, edited by Rabbi W. Gunther Plaut (New York: Union of American Hebrew Congregations, now Union for Reform Judaism, 1981)
